### NOAM CHOMSKY: THE AMERICAN SOLZHENITSYN ONE-OFF EVENT: Friday October 28 2022

This is an introduction by Paul Strutynski to the political thought of Noam Chomsky, the American linguistics giant and internationally famous political dissident. While the Soviet dissident, Alexander Solzhenitsyn, exposed the operation of Gulag labour camps in the USSR, Chomsky has been exposing his own country's contribution to human suffering in third world countries. In contrast to Solzhenitsyn, who was lauded in the US, Chomsky's political writings have been shunned, despite Chomsky being described, for example, as "the world's leading public intellectual", "the most important intellectual alive", and a "global phenomenon".

### Thursday October 20 - A visit to the MERIMBULA Poo Ponds or STP

Bega Valley Shire Council owns & operates 10 Sewage Treatment Plants. In 2009, NSW EPA instructed Council to upgrade the Merimbula STP and construct an ocean outfall to dispose of excess treated waste water during high rainfall periods.

We will be on site, not only in the Operations Center but walking around the plant seeing & learning how 700 million litres of waste water is processed each year.

How has Merimbula STP increased efficiency? Is it

possible to increase the Reuse of treated waste water from 25%? Talk with the experts who really know.

Biosolids stockpile area

Catch pond (during refurbishment)

### **WALKING - ADVENTURE WALKING**

Bega River Walungari Trail

On Thursday, September 1, the Adventure Walking group met at the Bega Cheese Heritage Centre on a beautiful sunny morning as befitted the first day of spring. We walked across the very clear and healthy looking Bega River via the pedestrian walkway of the Princes Highway bridge and down the stairs to the wide concreted track through the playing fields. We followed the walking track via Kisses Lagoon admiring the bird life, particularly a new family of Black swans who swam to welcome us (despite our not feeding them).





We then walked around the Bega Recreation Ground and Sports Field alongside the creek and towards and down a small section of Auckland Street, all bordering lush green fields with a variety of bird life. We then joined the Walungari Trail by the Bega River, meaning 'down stream' in the local Djiringanj language.

This beautiful trail through large river oaks (Casuarina) has easy access side trails to the river and much work and planting by local groups has saved the river banks from erosion.

We followed the trail to the Old Bega Racecourse before returning along the same walk after a rest and refreshment stop by the river.

We walked 8 kilometres in total on a flat and comfortable surface and stopped for coffee and sustenance at the Bega Cheese Heritage Centre on our return.

I'm a relatively recent arrival to the Sapphire Coast, having relocated to Tura Beach at the end of 2019. I lived in the Bega Valley for a brief time in the late 80s so it was great to return to an area I loved ... I grew up on a farm in Central Western NSW and really enjoy being back in the country after living in big cities for much of my adult life. An absolute bonus is being near the beach, where I can be found walking our dog most mornings.

My husband and I moved here having lived overseas for 17 years – 4 years in London where I managed hostels for homeless people, and 13 years in France, where amongst other things we converted a 400 year old olive mill into an apartment. And embarrassingly, I am still not fluent in French!

As a newcomer to the area, U3A was the logical place for me to meet people, learn new skills and make a contribution. I enjoy participating in several U3A activities, and have very much appreciated the warm welcome I have received.

I'm not sure what specific skills I bring to U3A and the secretary role in particular, but I guess having had a successful career in the management of social welfare services, I'm a bit of an all rounder. We meet the 1st Saturday of each month in the U3A Tura Beach Centre, 10:00 - 12:00pm. Cost \$4.


