It's not too late to take up Bahasa Indonesia (which simply means Indonesian language). This language is spoken by almost 280 million people in one of our closest neighbouring countries. Tutor Dorothea Polonyi discovered Indonesia back in the mid-1970s, when she spent an idyllic month in Bali, at the end of a "hippie trail" journey from Europe to home in Australia. Ten years later, she decided to study Bahasa Indonesia and Indonesian politics and history at the ANU in Canberra, and then became an academic librarian at the ANU Menzies Library, specialising in all things

Indonesian. Last year she went to Jogjakarta in Java for a language refresher course, and that inspired her to share her interests with others. In the course you'll learn to speak well enough to get around, order food, go shopping, and make friends, and you'll also learn about Indonesian culture. We've all read that bees are vital for the survival of many plants, animals and ultimately humans. For those interested in knowing more about bees and/or bee-keeping, expert bee-keeper Stephen Targett is offering a four-week course beginning Friday March 1, 11.30am - 12.30pm at the Tura Beach Centre. In the course, you'll learn about castes of bees, why bees swarm, the annual life of a hive, bees and pollination, the relationship between bees and flowers, and the intricacies of honey. The course will answer questions such as where do native neon cuckoo bees lay their eggs, what are leaf cutter bees, teddy bear bees or blue banded bees, and why keep bees. It will also look at what equipment is essential to have a hive and the pros and cons of a flow hive.


