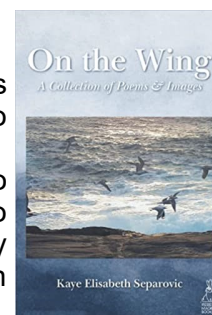

COURSE LEADER PROFILE – LORRAINE YOUNG - CRITIQUING CINEMA



I've loved films for as long as I can remember; my first job was at Columbia Pictures in Sydney and I have also worked for Australasian Film Hire and Village Roadshow, all of which was very exciting! Fast forward many years, and I still enjoy watching films of all genres, and seeing how all the different elements of filmmaking come together to make a brilliant, average or bad film. I am a regular cinemagoer and also attend special event screenings at our local cinema, such as the Sydney Film Festival and Flickerfest.

When my partner Ray Redman and I moved to Tura Beach in 2018, we joined U3A and have each participated in various courses. One I always especially enjoyed was Critiquing Cinema, with Molly Lehane as Course Leader, so when Molly resigned in August 2020, I volunteered to take on the job. Also, in September 2020 I was asked to be one of a group of three people to review two new cinema releases monthly on 97.5 Power FM community radio station; that has since changed to fortnightly. This has been really enjoyable and gives me an opportunity to mention the Critiquing Cinema group and U3A in general.

We are so lucky to have a twin-screen cinema in Merimbula, (the next closest is Narooma) and it's great to be able to support a local business. Our group meet on the fourth Thursday of every month (except school holidays), usually for a morning screening. As a gesture to U3A Critiquing Cinema members, The Picture Show Man's owner Jesse Tankard has offered a \$3.00 discount, so your ticket will now cost \$10.00. Afterwards, we go across to the Sapphire Club, where we meet in the café area to have a coffee or whatever you'd like and discuss the film.

We've had some wonderful discussions; we each give our thoughts and feelings about the film – loved it, hated it or no strong feelings either way. What about the plot, characterisation, cinematography, sound, emotional impact and so much more – we're all different and have different viewpoints, and I love hearing them all!

Covid has greatly impacted the Critiquing Cinema schedule in the past two years, as is the case for all the U3A courses, but I'm hoping that 2022 will see some previous members returning and new members joining our friendly group.

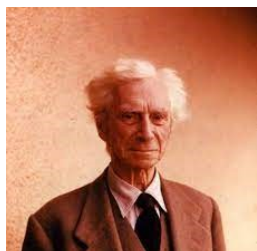

Low Tech Social Group



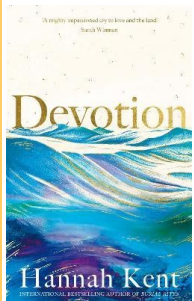
Would you like to be part of an 'outernet' social group that Leonie Barrett is proposing? What's that you ask?

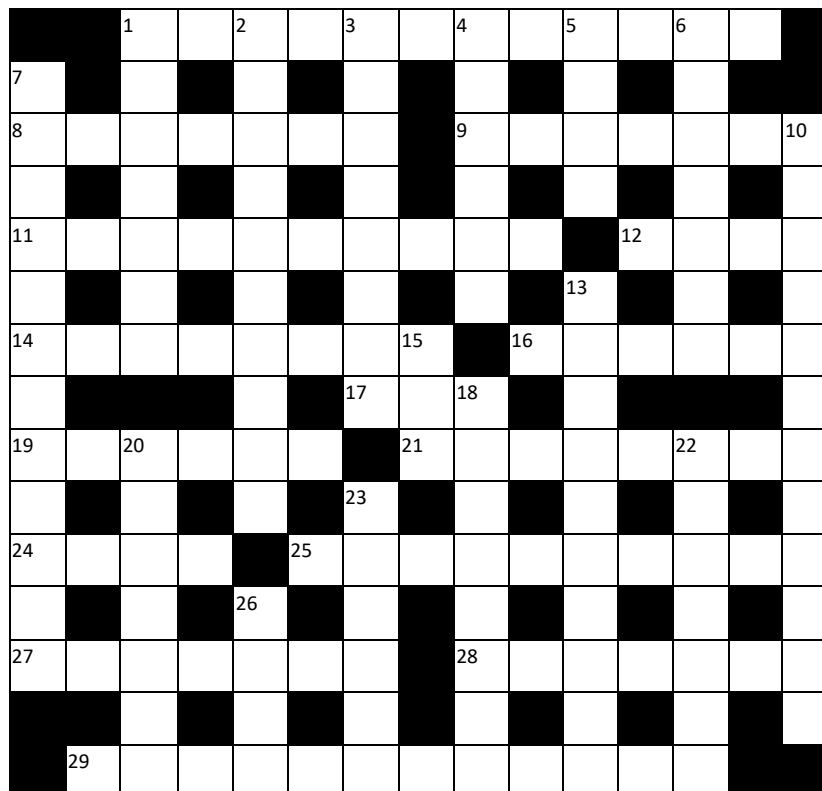

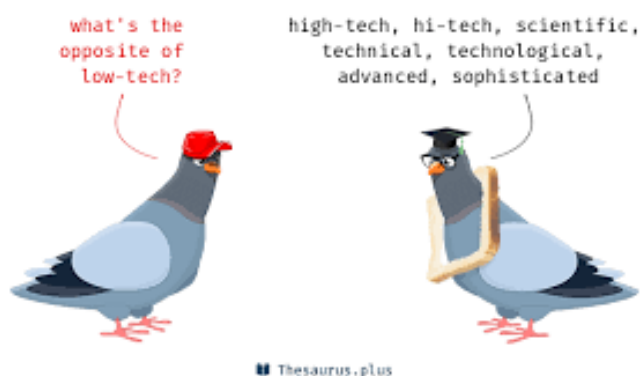
