PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Two quick thoughts this month.

The first is the importance of everyone paying their \$30 annual fee. We need it to pay rent, electricity, cleaning, rates, and water bills, amongst other things. Plus, the bills go up every year. Some people still haven't paid this year's fee, but payment of the fee is not optional, it's essential. In fact, you shouldn't be attending U3A courses if you haven't paid it. It's easy to keep putting it off, but the year is a third of the way gone and it's time to do the right thing. Please help us to keep helping you.

The second thought is to give you some feedback on the main issue of discussion at the AGM at the end of March: how to ensure a steady stream of volunteers to take over from our existing volunteers (such as me) who need to move on because of family issues, giving others a go, illness or plain burnout. I suggested it in my annual report as the main ongoing challenge for our organisation.

There is no problem at the moment, but it is an issue that the Management Team will be keeping to the fore, especially since several Team members, including me, will probably be finishing up at the end of the year. The challenge is to get people to put their hands up, and there was much discussion at the AGM about how to do that, with former President Fleur Dwyer making a spirited contribution. It's now up to the Management Team to actively pursue the issue with the membership.

But some will have the capacity to do so: to serve on the Office team or Program Team or Newsletter team or Management team (or run it!); or run an ongoing course or give a one-off talk. 

FILM REVIEW MOTHERING SUNDAY

This film is based on a book of the same name by Graham Swift; other films by Swift that have also been adapted to films are Waterland and Last Orders. In this film, Jane Fairchild is the first character we meet, an orphan in service as a maid in the home of an aristocratic English family, the Nivens who have lost sons during World War 1. We, the viewers, see the world through the eyes of Jane, as she shares her birds eye view of the family who employ her, after all, who but the oppressed, know their oppressors better than they know themselves?

The film exposes issues of wealth and class and of how these socio-economic advantages inevitably provide access to the literature of the day collected in the shelves of the libraries of the English upper classes. Jane, having access to the Niven's extensive library, learns how 'literature' might be written for a specific reader, how a life of adventure on the seas for boys, conditions them for war. This exposure to the written word also provides Jane with an opportunity to educate herself and ultimately, to break through the English class barrier by becoming a writer herself.

The story is infused with love, loss, beauty and grief as Jane looks back upon her time as a maid as she begins her life as an author amid a new era of social change. The cinema photography is magnificent, and the intimate play of light, poignantly beautiful. It also has a star studded cast.


