PRESIDENT'S REPORT



No annual fee increase for 2023

Good news! The Management Team has reviewed our finances as we go into the final quarter of the year and decided there will be no annual fee increase in 2023.

Admittedly, our annual fee is already pretty low. We surveyed 25 mainly regional U3As up and down the east coast and our fee is right near the bottom. But we nevertheless felt that there was no pressing need for an increase.

For a while there it seemed a possibility. As you know, our membership numbers dipped substantially during the COVID crisis, down from a pre-COVID high of well over 500 to a low of 312 at the start of this year. But, luckily for us, member numbers have been gradually rising this year and are now around 390—not a spectacular rebound, but one nevertheless. So, revenue is rising and, importantly, we have money in the bank to cover any possible deficits. Taking everything into account, our finances are in reasonable shape—sound enough to avoid a fee increase.

There may be a way we can all contribute to making this outcome even more likely, which takes me to my second topic.

Encourage a friend to join

Some of you may not know that we have an end-of-year deal for new members. From October 1, new members can get up to 15 months membership (from October 1 2022 to December 31 2023) for the price of a 12 month fee.

Most of us would have at least one friend or acquaintance who might find U3A attractive. So what better time to promote our wares to them with this deal on offer?

Our costs tend not to rise as our member numbers rise, so the more members we have the more financially secure we become—and the less likely it is that we will need any fee increases. So do yourself, and a friend, a favour and spread the message.

Christmas party

On a lighter note, one significant planned expenditure item this year is our Christmas party, scheduled for November 30 at the Sapphire Club in Merimbula. U3A will be providing a 50 per cent subsidy for the cost of the meal, as has been the case in the past. Yep, that time of the year is fast approaching. See below for more information.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ONLINE ENROLMENT IN U3A SAPPHIRE COAST COURSES

a. Log in to manage your Membership and enrolments by clicking on the Member Log-in button on our home page at:

[https:// www.sapphirecoastu3a.org](https://www.sapphirecoastu3a.org)

b. After you login the next screen you will see is your Membership Status page, with details of your address, phone numbers, your email address, emergency contact details etc.

c. To enrol in a Course (including One-Offs) click on the “Classes” button (this will show as “Classes 2022”).

d. You will get a full list of all Courses for the selected year. Each Course includes a Request Box you can click on to enrol in a course. On the right-hand side you can see the class status and you can select any Courses that have an Open, TBA or Wait List status.

- **Open** – you will receive immediate confirmation of enrolment. For all Courses you should still contact the Course Leader to confirm your place.
- **TBA** – the Course Leader will review and approve your application before enrolment is accepted – you must contact the Course Leader to discuss.
- **Wait List** – the Course is full, but if space becomes available you will be notified
- **Closed** – this Course is not open to new Course members
- **Cancelled** – this Course will not run
- **Office Only** - you will need to enrol or book a place by following the instructions that are part of the Course description

e. You need to scroll all the way down to the bottom of the Course list and Click on the “Next” button to complete your Course selection(s). This takes you to your Member Summary page which will now include a list of all the Courses you have selected.

f. If you are not a financial member your enrolments will not be confirmed until you pay your membership fees. You can do this by clicking on the “Pay Online” button on your Member Summary page. Separate instructions about renewing your membership are available from our Website home page. All memberships must be renewed and paid by the last day of February each year for any enrolments or enrolment requests to remain active.

g. If for any reason you decide you no longer want to be enrolled in a course or attend an event you should login again and click on the check box next to the classes/events from which you are withdrawing. Then select “Delete classes”. This will free up your place for any members on the Wait List.

h. Before attending any Course for the first time you should contact the Course Leader to confirm your enrolment and to check for any changes to class details.

i. It is worth checking back regularly for anything new that may have been added to the program since you last looked. One of the many advantages of our online enrolment system is that you will always see what is current, so we can respond to offers of new Courses and list them for you to enrol in as they happen.

Please also note that places on the courses will be allocated first to Bermagui members and only to our members if there is still room (the same applies with our courses and them).

'Between Two Worlds'



This month's film was chosen by Sylvie, so no surprise it was French!! The Film *Between Two Worlds*, is based on a book in which a French journalist (played by Juliet Binoche) gets her '*hands dirty*' as she explores the world of insecure employment in France and takes a series of jobs as a "maintenance agent" a face-saving term for a cleaner. This position brings her face to face with an exploited French underclass, unable to find secure full-time jobs. She, along with her fellow co-workers, are exposed to rude bosses, back-breaking schedules, and a hideous variety of unflushed loos and unmade beds. Not only does she get her '*hands dirty*', but in doing so she

exposes the fragility of her moral integrity as she too, exploits the lives of these workers for her own journalistic gain.

Our group found the film quite absorbing and the issues it exposed evoked an interesting discussion. We were particularly impressed by the non professional actors employed from a cleaning company who played their roles so well and interacted with Juliet Binoche's character, Marianne, so believably.

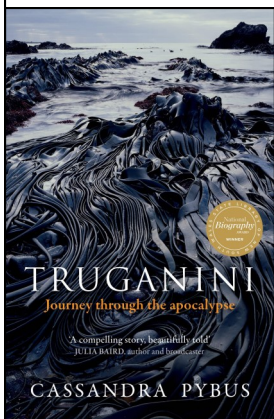

The Fourth Wednesday Book Group has been meeting at the Tura Beach Centre for over seven years with occasional changes in membership as people come and go from the area but with a consistent core of committed readers who've become good friends. Over this time we've read some wonderful books - from classics to current authors, from literature to well written detective stories from Australian and international authors and had some great discussions about a variety of topics. We've mainly kept to fiction but in recent times have added non fiction written as fiction - a newish genre which has inspired some interesting discussions.

Last meeting we discussed "Truganini: Journey through the apocalypse" by Cassandra Pybus, a Tasmanian historian who is a descendant of an early British settler of Bruny Island who farmed a land grant where Truganini was born in the country of her clan, the Nuenonne. In this genre that attempts to personalise the historical characters, it was a depressing but fascinating book to read with its historical accuracy and we discussed at length how much of a gap there had been in our school and university learning about the history of the deliberate displacement and devastation of the Tasmanian (and mainland) indigenous tribes with white settlement. SBS is currently screening a new series "Australian Wars" which is about this part of our history and last night was about Tasmania's hidden history - a visual reenactment of much of this story.

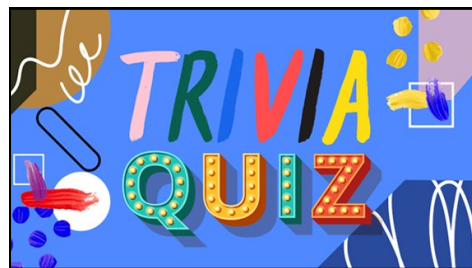

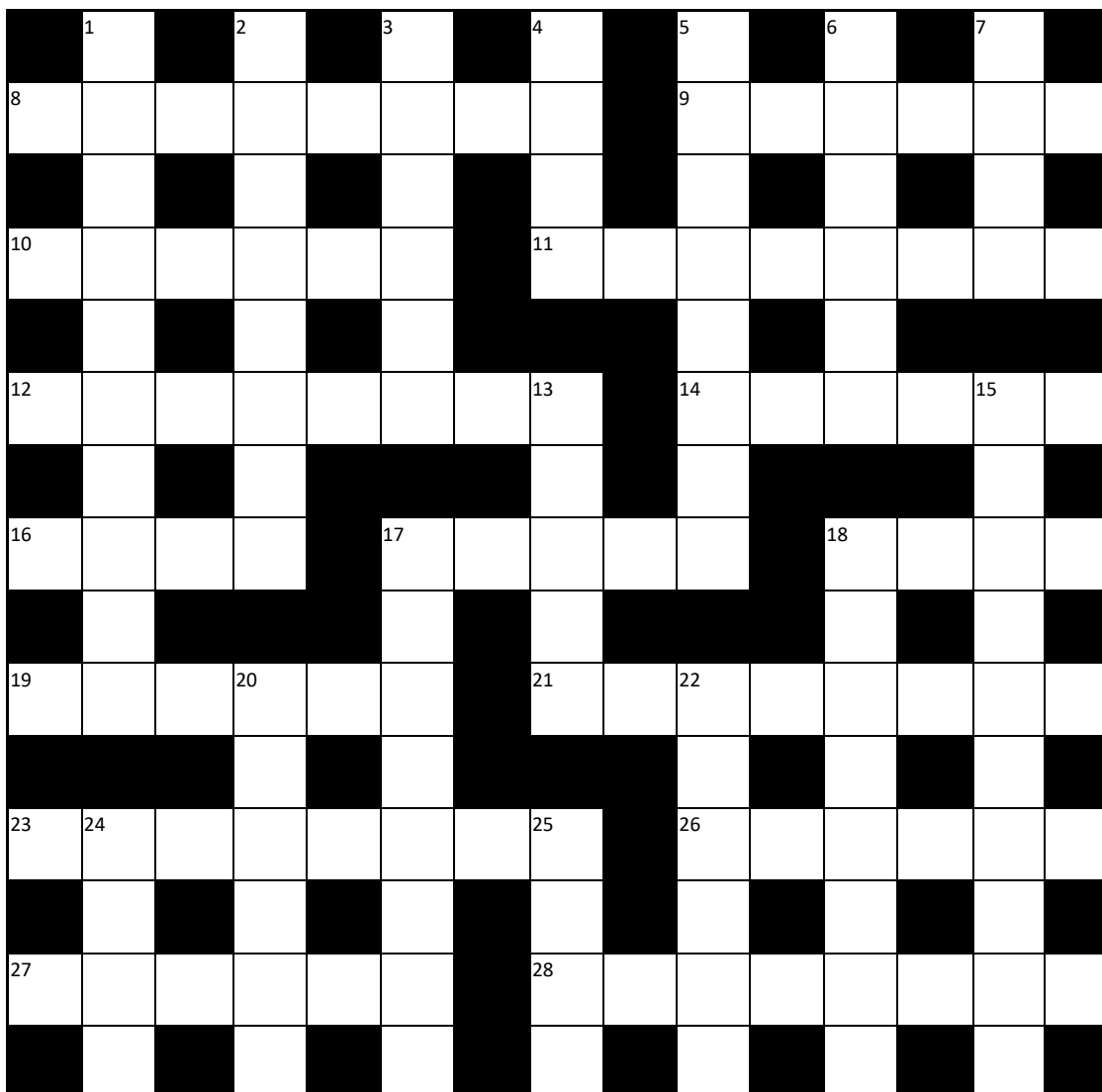


RECORDER GROUP

SOUTH COAST HISTORY SOCIETY

Peter Lacey, President of the South Coast History Society, has advised the Society has organised the showing of some of the most highly acclaimed history-based films to be screened in the coming months at the Picture Show Man in Merimbula - and **admission is FREE**. This has been made possible by a grant from the NSW Government and Bega Valley Shire Council's Community Grants Program.

The three films to be screened are as follows:

'The King's Speech' on Monday, October 17 at 10.00am. This film received an Oscar for the Best Motion Picture of the Year in 2011 and Colin Firth also received an Oscar for Best Performance by an Actor in a Leading Role for his portrayal of King George VI who was battling to overcome a debilitating stammer.

'Schindler's List' on Monday, November 7 at 10.00am This film also received an Academy Award for Best Motion Picture.

'Lincoln' on Monday, December 5 at 10.00am. This film won [Best Production Design](#) and [Best Actor](#) for Daniel Day-Lewis.

The historical context of these films will be explained in a very short introduction by South Coast History Society that precedes each screening. **No bookings are necessary**.
